Dear CCCS Parents & Guardians,

I want to thank you for getting those re-registration forms back to us. There was a very strong initial return representing 93% of eligible students! Although we are still waiting for a reply from a handful of families who were unable to respond for various reasons, we do have 14 new applications and with our healthy Kindergarten enrollment on top of that, we are already in a very good position for next year.

One of the benefits of attending Cathedral School that is not often mentioned (or even remembered) until this time of year, is the charitable tax receipt issued to families. For families paying full fees (without an Anglican or sibling discount) who had their account fully up to date on Dec 31, this amounts to a \$3,240 receipt per child for the current year. Although this amount will vary year to year, it represents a significant savings in income tax owed. Just one more reason that you should tell all your friends about Christ Church Cathedral School's Open House tomorrow!

Meanwhile, our students continue to benefit from great teaching. Just today, for example, the grade one and grade two students watched as Mrs. Meissner dissected a real (yet deceased) salmon! Mrs. Meissner led the class through a very detailed lesson about the form and function of the various parts of a salmon. I believe she may have just planted the seeds for a career in marine biology for many of our young learners.

Our Shrove Tuesday breakfast is next week and I'm looking forward to flipping pancakes for your children.
