Dear Parents & Guardians,

I have some news to share about next year's teaching positions. Although I do not have the full picture of who will be teaching what, it is time to let you know who will be moving on.

After 26 years of dedicated and outstanding service to Cathedral School, Julia Borzoni will retire this June. Julia joined the school as a *volunteer* teacher in 1991 beginning as a French teacher. She then taught the grade 4-7 class and finally settled into grade 5 a decade and a half ago. "Grade five is my favourite!" she lets everyone know. Julia is also a member of the Cathedral Choir and has been singing at the 11:00am service for well over 10 years. She has kept our school prominently positioned in the local speech festival and the Island Catholic Schools Public Speaking Competitions and has always ensured our students were well-prepared to represent the school and themselves. I know she will particularly enjoy this year's poems, dramas and speeches. I recently took an alumnus on a tour of the school before she submitted an application to kindergarten. She was delighted to hear that Mrs. B. was still here and we bee-lined it upstairs. This mother told me that she owed her interest in literature and her writing skills to Mrs. B. It was a poignant reunion. Julia's plans are to enjoy her new granddaughter who is here in Victoria and to do lots of volunteering. Words cannot do justice to the debt that Cathedral School owes to Julia. We wish her the very best in this next stage of her life.

Another of our long-serving teachers will be stepping into a new position next fall. Matt Lurie has decided it is time to broaden his horizons and has been hired on with the Saanich School District. He is not yet certain, but believes a Master's program may be in his future. Matt has taught at Cathedral School for 13 years. He taught upstairs and down, but will no doubt be remembered as an awesome grade three teacher. Matt also stepped up as Acting Vice Principal when Tobi took a maternity leave and he did a great job for me. I know this has been a difficult decision for Matt but we all know his dedication and skill will continue to make a difference in the lives of his students. We'll miss you Matt!

Finally, Deanna Coleman surprised us all with her announcement of the grand adventure that is on her horizon. Deanna and her family are moving to Costa Rica! She says the timing is right for her young family and the opportunity is there. Deanna stepped into the very large shoes of Christina Majcher two years ago and has done a superb job filling those shoes. I cannot express my gratitude enough. She has worked hard to develop relationships with our teachers, EAs, and other support workers in the community – all for the purpose of supporting our students. Reminder: If you gave us post-dated cheques for the third term of lunches, your cheque will be cashed on Monday, April 3.

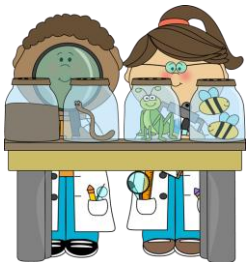

Easter Break – **Thursday, April 13 - Monday, April 16.** Lux Mundi is NOT available.

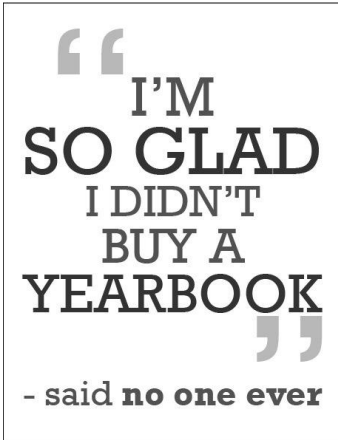
