

Christ Church Cathedral School Uniform Guideline

Uniform items can be ordered directly from [Cambridge Uniforms](#) (**except for P.E. gym shirts, which are ordered from the school office**). Cambridge and Company staff visit our school once per year in May or June for a uniform fitting. If you are not able to attend, a sizing kit of most items is kept in the School Office. Please contact the school to setup an appointment.

Students must wear the School uniform on their way to and from School and throughout the school day, including the correct P.E. strip for gym.

The Christ Church Cathedral School uniform is a symbol of belonging to our School and should be worn with pride. Please note the following rules regarding uniforms and general appearance:

- All hair accessories, i.e., barrettes, elastics and ribbons must be in the School colours of red, blue, white or yellow. No patterned accessories.
- Hair dye must be in natural colours only.
- Makeup and jewellery are not permitted – except watches or medical alert bracelets, and stud earrings for those with pierced ears.
- All uniforms must be complete and kept clean and repaired. Gym strip should be taken home once per week to be washed.
- Shirts should be tucked in and belts worn for boys grades 4–8.

If a student is not dressed in proper uniform, the student will be asked by the teacher to return to school in proper uniform the next day. If the student returns to school without the proper uniform a second time, a note will be sent home asking for parental assistance and support. If the student is still not dressed correctly, corrective action will be taken.

If an item has been lost or is on order and has not yet arrived, we will, of course, make allowances for that.

From time to time during the school year, we may have a “mufti” day when students may wear their own clothes to school. The guidelines for dress on those occasions are as follows:

No muscle shirts

No short shorts or excessively short skirts

No underwear showing

No bare midriffs

No halter tops or spaghetti straps

No offensive slogans on T-shirts
